

## BIOGRAPHICAL STATEMENTS – HISTORY DEPARTMENT

**Professor Mircea Anghelinu** is doctor in history since 2004. He is specialized in prehistoric archaeology, human evolution, cultural anthropology and history of archaeology. He published and edited several books and more than 50 papers in various journals in Romania and abroad, also directing or participating several nationally and internationally funded research grants. He is currently the elected Head of History Department. Areas of current professional interest and recent researches focus around Paleolithic hunter-gatherer archaeology, social evolution, and cultural-evolutionary theory.

**Reader Denis Căprăroiu** is doctor in history since 2007. He is specialized in medieval history and archaeology, with a particular focus on the beginnings of Romanian medieval states and on the emergence of medieval towns in outer Carpathians Romania. He published several books and many papers on these topics. His current research topics regard the typology of the emergence medieval towns in Valachia and Moldavia in connection to the early development of these political entities.

**Reader Cosac Marian** is doctor in history since 2008. He is specialized in Ancient History and Prehistoric Archaeology and published several books and papers. His current research interests cover both Paleolithic and Iron and Bronze Age period and are directly connected to the archaeological excavation of several settlements in Romanian Carpathians.

**Reader Iulian Oncescu** is doctor in history since 2007. His background and research activity focus around Modern History and especially on the Romanian-French relationships in the XIX<sup>th</sup> century. He published several books and edited many documentary sources on these matters.

**Lecturer Monica Mărgărit** is doctor in history since 2008. Her field of expertise is the evolution of the exploitation strategies of animal environment for non-alimentary purposes along Prehistory. She led or joined several research grants and authored several books and many papers regarding prehistoric technology on hard organic materials.

**Lecturer Radu Cârciumar** is doctor in history since 2009. He is specialized in medieval history, with a special focus on the emergence of Romanian medieval states and the evolutions of these entities between the XIV<sup>th</sup> and the XVI<sup>th</sup> century. His list of publications includes several books and papers.

**Assistant Cezar Stanciu** is doctor in history since 2008. He is specialized in the history of Romanian Communism and published several books and articles on the topic, in Romania and abroad. He also currently acts as secretary of the “Grigore Gafencu Center for International Relations History and editor-in-chief of *Valahian Journal of Historical Studies*. His areas of professional interest are comparative history of Communist regimes in East Central Europe, social interactions under Communist regimes, Soviet-East European relations.

**Assistant Laura Oncescu** is doctor in history since 2009. Her field of expertise and main research focus is Modern History and especially the Romanian-Italian relationships in modern times. She authored one book and several papers on these issues.
